Math Kangaroo is unique to other math competitions in its inclusiveness to students of all math levels and a variety of ages. We are one of the few math competitions in the U.S. open to students in elementary school through high school. Our math competition questions are unique and superb; the question creators and development teams are compiled from mathematicians representing nations all over the world. Nearly one hundred countries are part of the international Kangaroo math coalition, with roughly 6 million students participating in their country's competition every year!

Mathematics is an important foundation for all scientific and technical subjects and is invaluable in developing the logic that applies to other disciplines as well. It is more important than ever to invest in children's education. We hope you join us in helping students grow in their technical abilities and skills in the classroom.

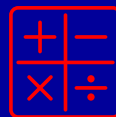

What We Do

For 25 years, Math Kangaroo has organized an annual international mathematical competition for thousands of students in grades 1-12. The 75-minute test consists of problems that have students thinking outside of the box and developing advanced problem-solving skills. Math Kangaroo also provides additional resources to help students prepare for the competition.



How We're Helping Students

Math Kangaroo Competition

We host the Math Kangaroo Competition on the third Thursday of March every year. Students complete 75 questions requiring them to think creatively and critically. Each participant receives a shirt, small prizes, and a certificate for participating.

Math Kangaroo Awards

We understand the importance of focusing less on the competitive aspect of the Math Kangaroo Competition and more on the collective sense of accomplishment participants feel. We host Math Kangaroo award ceremonies across the country so participants can celebrate their achievements alongside their friends and family. As part of the awards, we also highlight top scorers and distribute scholarships to graduating seniors who have participated in the competition over several years.

Individual & group coaching

We provide coaching on a group and individual basis and preparatory classes for students looking for additional support and instruction between the competition.

Practice resources for students

Math Kangaroo provides booklets and free resources for students looking for additional practice and support while preparing for the Math Kangaroo Competition. We also post weekly video questions and team up with other organizations to provide Live-Solve events and educational webinars.

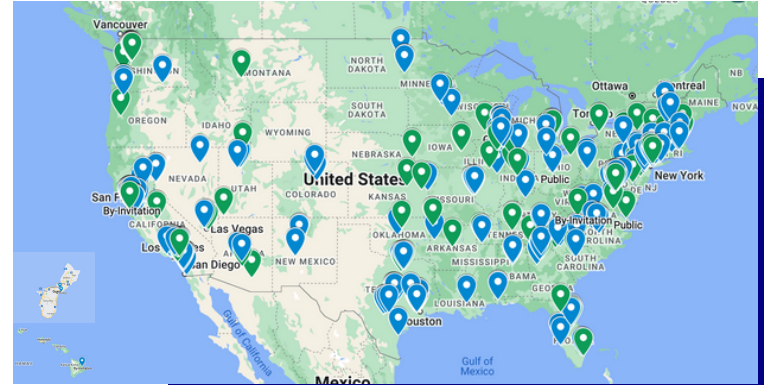
Lesson Plans for Teachers

Our Impact

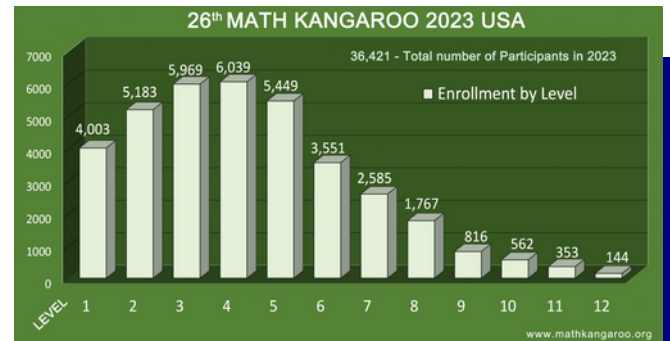
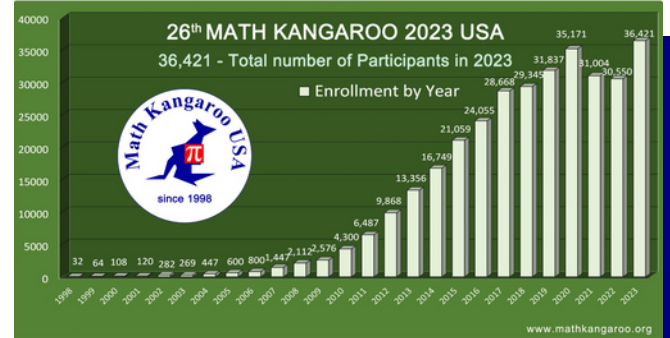

Our Enrollment

Since our founding in 1998, Math Kangaroo has served over 300,000 students, helping them gain logic and critical thinking skills, and helping them improve their math scores.

Math Kangaroo is one of the only math competitions connected to an international Math Kangaroo organization that operates in dozens of countries around the globe. We are also one of the only national math competitions allowing elementary-grade students to participate. Our goal is to reach students as early as possible to instill a love and understanding for math at an early age.

Bringing Math Kangaroo to Your School

Schools have the option to open a Math Kangaroo Center as an in-person location or as an online (proctored) Center. The number of students participating may vary, with a **minimum of ten** students needed. School participation can be managed by a teacher, administrative official, or parent. End-of-season financial incentives may be granted to Math Kangaroo organizers.

Parents may cover the cost of participation, or schools can cover the cost of participation for their students, allowing more to take part in the competition and annual activities.

Participation Rates:

- School Rate- **\$21 per student**
- Title I School Rate- **\$11 per student**

Materials from Math Kangaroo

- Paper test or access to virtual test
- Access to sample questions, exams, video questions/solutions, and some webinars
- Educational toy

Competition Winners Receive:

- Top 3 in country/state: Medal and ribbon
- Top 10 in country/Top 3 in state: Educational in-kind gifts
- Top 10 middle and high school students:
 - Invitation to educational seminars
 - Consideration for scholarships
 - Consideration for national/international all-expense paid math camps
- Top 20 in country: Winner magnet
