

MATH KANGAROO USA


ABOUT

Inspiring a passion for mathematics, Math Kangaroo USA is a national nonprofit dedicated to helping students love math. For 28 years, Math Kangaroo has organized an annual international mathematics competition for students in grades K-12. The competition consists of a single round administered on the same date (the third Thursday of March) to thousands of students at registered centers. Math Kangaroo focuses on improving students' math skills and teaching them new strategies for solving word and logic problems.




HISTORY

The idea for an annual math competition was started in the 1980s by Australian mathematician Peter O'Halloran. The competition questions tested students' basic computational skills, logical thinking, and problem-solving strategies with creative, imaginative, and intriguing problems. In 1995, the competition took a significant step when it was implemented in France under the moniker "Kangaroo" to recognize the Australian origins. From there, the competition quickly spread to other countries.
